
Mr Walcot's Gift: making a difference in Lambeth since 1667



The Walcot Foundation

We are an independent grant-making foundation. Our work is to break cycles of financial deprivation as they affect people living in Lambeth.

Our approach is to offer a hand up, not a hand out. We seek to tackle poverty by creating opportunity.

In the last five years we have made over 1500 grants to individuals and organisations totalling more than £9.4m.

We fund a wide range of projects within our Governors' triennial priorities,* all of which seek to help low income Lambeth people become financially self-sufficient.

Occasionally we fund special projects. In recent years we spent over one million pounds in ensuring a sustainable Credit Union for Lambeth and in running a bespoke Apprenticeship Scheme for Lambeth young people not in education, employment or training (NEET).

The majority of our grants are for people under 30 (in fewer cases, 30+). Please see our website for more about our work.

Edmund Walcot

Edmund Walcot, our principal benefactor, was a successful local businessman. In his Will of January 1667 he left 17 acres of land in what today is North Lambeth. He directed that the rents from the land were to be used for the relief of the poor.

Today the Foundation's assets are in the form of stock market investments and property centred on the historic Walcot Estate. We use them to generate the income from which we run our grant-making programmes.

We seek to tackle contemporary forms of poverty in contemporary ways. We think Mr Walcot would approve.
